



Funding for CLEP[®] Exams Extended to Eligible Military Veterans

VETERANS:

If you are an eligible veteran, you can receive full reimbursement for CLEP exam and administration fees from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

CLEP Benefits:

- **Save money.** CLEP offers students the opportunity to receive college credit by earning qualifying scores on exams. You can make the most of your GI Bill tuition benefits by applying those funds toward needed coursework.
- **Save time.** CLEP allows students to bypass courses in subject areas for which they already have knowledge. You can accelerate your degree program by moving to higher-level courses more quickly.

CLEP Facts:

- All 34 CLEP exams are administered on computer, offering instant score reports (with the exception of English Composition with Essay).
- Over 2,900 colleges and universities grant credit or advanced standing for satisfactory scores on CLEP exams. *Students are advised to check their college's credit-granting policy prior to taking an exam.*
- The 90-minute exams are administered at 1,300 college test centers across the country.
